Sveta is a Research Fellow on the ERC funded <u>MISTS</u> (Market-Based Initiatives as Solutions to Techno-Scientific Problems) programme of research, which aims at investigating markets' ability of problem solving by employing the STS move to engage with markets.

Having completed her PhD in Sociology supervised by Donald MacKenzie and Alex Preda at the University of Edinburgh, Sveta joined the Sociology department in June 2013. Her research interests are located in social studies of finance (SSF) and her doctoral research is a sociological analysis of the knowledge production with regard to an important financial instrument - a currency derivative. In her analysis of the legal aspect of knowledge production she employs the analytical tradition of science studies. By drawing on the example of how local, seemingly small-scale legal developments have large, indeed global implications by enhancing liquidity and legal safety of the cross-border trade, her research calls attention to the link between micro and macro phenomena in financial markets.
